










Intersectionality





Barriers

- Limited **knowledge** of welfare needs
- Inadequate equipment and husbandry provisions
- Minimal access to professional animal health and welfare services
- Harsh living and working **environments**
- High work-loads



Potentially harmful practices






	Examples
Husbandry	 Single stabling & stallion isolation Low roughage, high concentrate diet Abrupt & early weaning Recurrent transportation
Equipment	- Nose-bands - Bits - Spurs - Whips
Interventions	 Wind operations & tubing Repeated AI & Caslick procedures Recurrent farriery Intra-articular injections












Approach to welfare improvement



1. Welfare problem

- Prioritise from animal's perspective
- Ask the animal
- Interrogate norms and assumptions





2. Causative factors

- Work and rest
- Proximal and distal
- Use the evidence base
- 'Find the woman who knows'




3. Influencing factors





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


Key findings
